We were joined by three entertainment industry legends who have been instrumental in bringing comic book culture to life on the Silver Screen – Stan Lee of Marvel Comics fame, Michael Uslan, Executive Producer of the “Batman” feature films, and Platinum Studios CEO and creator of the Summer Blockbuster, “Cowboys and Aliens”, Scott Rosenberg.

Michael Uslan, accompanied by several TPT students, threw out the first pitch in honor of Team Prime Time. Another highlight of the evening was a Q & A session with Stan Lee, who shared fantastic stories about the many comic heroes he created.

The day’s events actually began hours before the Opening Pitch, when Michael Uslan, David Uslan and Scott Rosenberg visited TPT’s Webster MS location to encour-

age literacy...and give out hundreds of comics.

“I grew up as a kid reading comic books, and to now share that experience with children who might not have otherwise had the chance is truly a gift,” says Platinum Studios CEO Scott Rosenberg. “The imagination inspired from within the pages of a comic book is truly limitless.”

Students Participate in “Dollies Making a Difference”

Students at TPT’s Westside Leadership Magnet location did their part to help make the world a better place by creating dollies for the children of Haiti who were affected by the 7.0 earthquake in January of last year.

Cindy Simon, a member of the Team Prime Time Advisory Board, was the inspiration behind this project, encouraging the kids to contribute to the relief effort after an article in the Cape Cod Times inspired her to create “Dollies Making a Difference”.

AmeriCares distributed the dollies in Haiti through two children’s organizations: Love A Child, which operates a malnutrition unit, health center, and orphanage surrounding the town of Fond Pariesien, and Explores Sans Frontiers, which provides health services and education to displaced persons in the village of Croix de Buquettes.

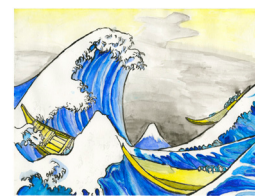
8th Grade Graduate from Emerson Middle School
