








HOMEWORK/ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Studio School students created podcast shows about holidays and popular topics around school.








Palms Middle School vs Emerson Middle School





A zine is a small-circulation self-published work of original or appropriated texts and images, usually reproduced via photocopier. The students created a zine based on their favorite things. They made coloring books from photographs and activity books with mazes, crossword puzzles and more based around their zine's topic. Popular Zine Topics Included: Shoes, School Locations, Animals and Food.

DICHTAL ART & 3D PRINTING

Using TinkerCad, students learn the basics of the XYZ axis, how to model and create three dimensional objects, and learn how to use computer shortcuts.
