

Pencil Sketching Project Students used only pencils to create characters. They worked on shading and different etching.




# Crochet By Highland Elementary School



Ornament Decorating Project Instead of using paint, students used clay to create these bold and wonderful ornaments.




# Fashion Design By Emerson CC Middle School

Graphic Design Project Students used a program called Design Space and a cutting machine called a Cricut to design these iron on decals.








